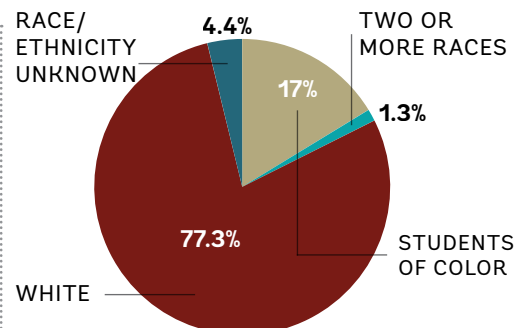

ETHNIC PROFILE

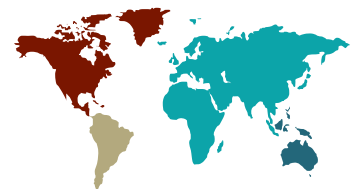


GEOGRAPHIC PROFILE

New England: 63%

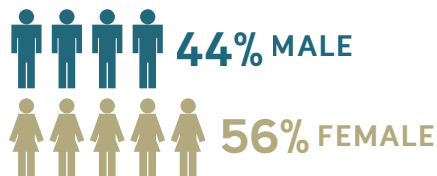

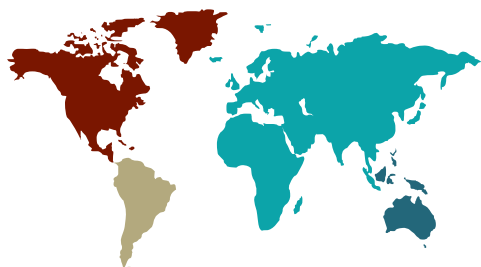

GEOGRAPHIC PROFILE

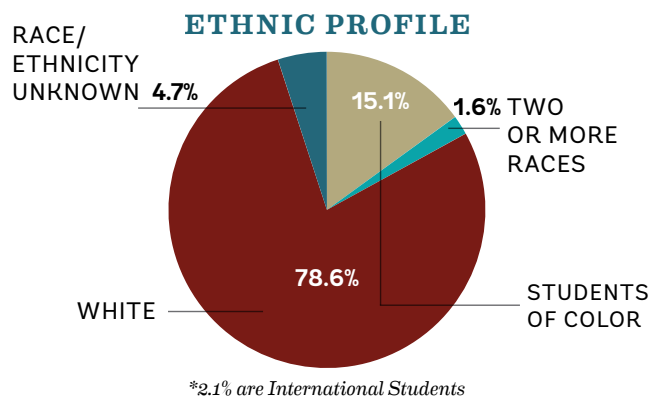

80% of 2016 graduates participated in an internship by the time they graduated

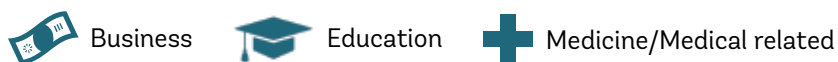
Internships are completed in various career fields such as business, healthcare, government, social services, public relations, and more during the fall, spring, and summer.

46% were working **in business fields** (accounting, financial services, insurance, marketing, advertising, or retail)

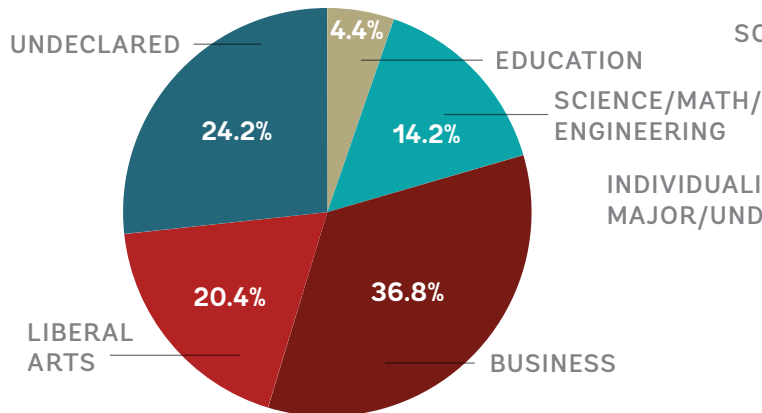

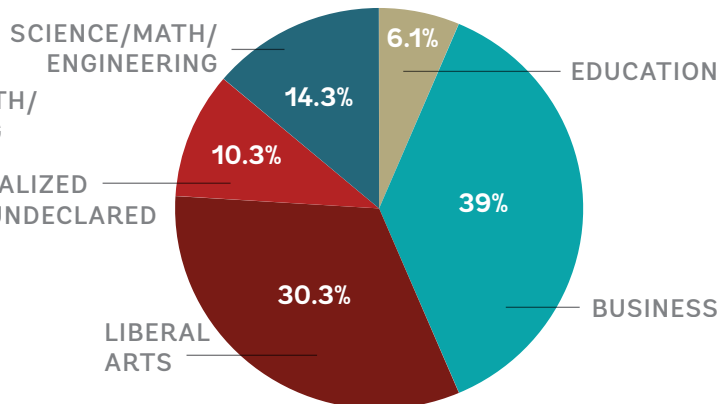
